

City of Llano Public Hearing Called City Council Meeting Minutes April 16, 2012 – 5:15 p.m.

A. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Reagor called the Public Hearing City Council meeting to order at 5:15 p.m. Those in attendance were Alderwoman Puryear, Mayor Pro-Tem Hazel, Alderman Decker, Alderwoman Simpson, and Alderman Hefner.

PUBLIC HEARING

The public hearing was held at City Hall, 301 West Main, Llano, TX, on April 16th at 5:15 p.m. At this meeting the following items were discussed:

- Locality/TxCDBG Citizen Participation Plan and Public Hearing Provisions
- All eligible activities under the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program
- Estimated amount of funds for activities that will meet the National Objective of benefit to low/moderate income persons.
- Amount of TxCDBG funding available
- Use of past TxCDBG contract funds (if applicable)
- Identification of housing needs/community development and/or economic development needs
- Selection of priorities
- Submission of Views and Proposals
- Plans of the locality to minimize displacement of persons and to assist persons actually displaced as a result of activities assisted with TxCDBG funds (if applicable)

Rudy Ruiz with Community Development Management Co., Inc gave a brief overview of the funding that is available throughout the State of Texas. There is approximately \$4 million available throughout the State. The City of Llano is planning to apply to the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) for a grant under the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program (TxCDBG) — Disaster Relief Fund. As part of the Disaster Relief application process, the City of Llano requests assistance from citizens in identifying community, housing, and economic development needs and selecting priorities. Those various projects mentioned while conducting the public hearing were identified as transportation — 2^{nd} river crossing; equipment assistance for the Fire Department; demolish, uninhabitable or sub-standard living housing, deemed unsafe for human occupancy; waste-water effluent collection system; city streets; infrastructure; economic development; drainage issues; and water activity. With there being no further public comments, Mayor Reagor closed the public hearing at 5:27 p.m.
